The only granite isles to be found mid-ocean, these lush green islands represent the most ancient archipelago in the world - the highest peaks of a submerged landmass that, over millions of years, broke apart from the supercontinent of Gondwanaland and drifted into isolation in the middle of the Indian Ocean.

Throughout the millienia ever since, the lifeforms cocooned within these islands were left to evolve in complete isolation.


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Day 7 - Friday
